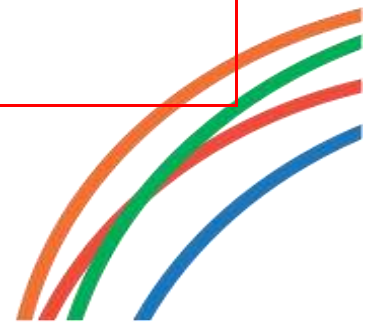




## Summer Arts Youth Program Grantees

Summer 2015 (FY15-16)

<b>6<sup>th</sup> Street Playhouse</b>	Youth/teen summer workshops providing training in acting, dance, and singing from master instructors, culminating in a 4-performance run of a Broadway-style musical.
<b>Art Escape</b>	Instruction will be provided in specific art techniques to enhance the students' proficiency. Projects include: urban lettering, mural painting, narrative projects, poetry and glass forming.
<b>Artstart</b>	My Story/Our Story Mural allows teens to design and paint their own story panel in a mural exploring their role in the community. The mural will be installed near the Newhall Bike Path. Related arts activity for younger kids will be incorporated.
<b>California Poets in the Schools</b>	Session Summer Lunch Brunch Poetry Program at 5 elementary schools. Each session will begin with poems by great authors and by the end students will write poems inspired by those works. The sessions will use "vetted" lessons about language and poetry tools. Program culminates in a poetry reading of new work.
<b>Healdsburg Center for the Arts</b>	"Me and My World" is a photography and creative writing program exploring students' uniqueness and connection to others and to the world around them. Photography elements teaches basic photo composition; writing is about getting ideas on paper and expressing themselves in writing.
<b>H-Town Youth Theatre</b>	Intensive 3 week musical theater training program developing skills through vocal, physical and imaginative games and exercises culminating with a community performance at HPAT and the County Fair.
<b>The Imaginists</b>	Eight week paid internship program providing education and job training in theater, performance and mentorship. Students get training, rehearse and perform alongside professional theater artists, culminating in 13 performances alongside professionals.
<b>Petaluma Center for the Arts</b>	Summer camp and back-to-school classes: 9 one-week camps providing hands-on arts learning activities; docent tours based on visual thinking strategies; digital arts free classes for Mentor Me for at-risk youth.



<b>Santa Rosa Symphony</b>	Three-week instrument training camp, most comprehensive classical music camp of its kind in Sonoma County, where 150 students study either in full days or in a la carte classes on the instrument of their choosing.
<b>Sebastopol Center for the Arts</b>	Four summer art camps, full day, using area's artist/teachers in performing, visual and literary arts. Each week is a different experience and concludes with an exhibition/performance.
<b>Transcendence Theatre Company</b>	Camp participants learn musical theater performance and production techniques with cast and crew members for one week, culminating in a performance with the full Transcendence Theatre Company.
<b>Wells Fargo Center for the Arts (now known as Luther Burbank Center for the Arts)</b>	Two Camps: One City Arts – 2 weeks of free visual art classes (year two after addressing Andy Lopez's death last year) – teaching is through observation, experimentation, discussion readings, exposure to other artists; Mariachi Camp led by award-winning local musician to increase youth appreciation of this cultural tradition.
