Fire Memorial Public Art Project

Update Spring 2024

In 2022, the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors approved the creation and installation of a memorial artwork recognizing the impact of the 2017 Wildfire Complex on the County's residents and specifically honoring the memories of those whose lives were lost. The project is being overseen by a Fire Memorial Task Force in conjunction with Creative Sonoma.

At their March 26, 2024 meeting, the Board of Supervisors approved Nagasawa Community Park in Fountaingrove as the preferred site for the Fire Memorial Public Art Project. The Fire Memorial Task Force conducted an analysis to identify a suitable location, starting with an extensive list of 32 potential sites. Nagasawa Community Park was identified as the preferred site after careful evaluation to ensure suitability, including consideration of the following project goals: emphasize tranquility, natural beauty, emotional resonance, and a significant connection to the events of the 2017 fires.

The next steps for the project include working with the City of Santa Rosa on the use of the park for the project, as well as preparing and publishing a RFQ for artists' qualifications. Community engagement opportunities related to the design of the memorial will be announced later this year.
